Main Ongoing Projects

Education Studies for Healthy Aging Research (EdSHARe)

The EdSHARe project consists of two education cohort studies – High School & Beyond (HS&B) and the National Longitudinal Study of the High School Class of 1972 (NLS-72) – which have been repurposed as studies of health and aging. These studies originated in the National Center for Education Statistics' (NCES) Secondary Longitudinal Studies Program.

Linking the 1940 U.S. Census to Modern Aging Surveys

I am leading an effort to find respondents to the HRS, the PSID, the WLS, NHATS, and NSHAP in the 1940 U.S. Census, when they were children living with their families. The resulting data will provide information about respondents' early life social, family, and neighborhood conditions.

Wisconsin Longitudinal Study (WLS)

The WLS has followed 10,317 Wisconsin high school seniors and their families since 1957. I have been involved with the WLS since 1991, first as a research assistant and most recently as an investigator on the 2010 surveys. (<http://www.ssc.wisc.edu/wlsresearch/>)

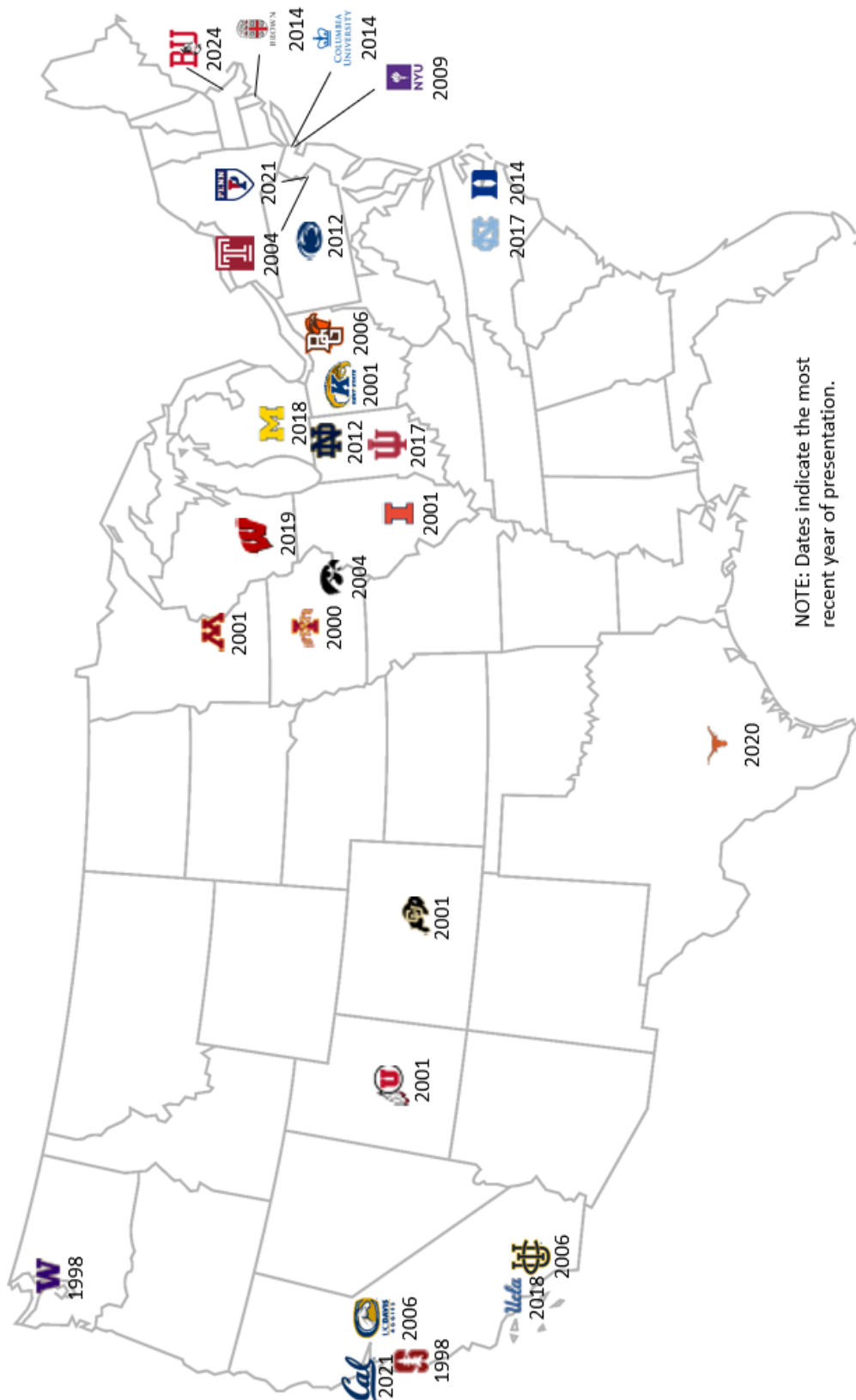
